For half of his three year term as President he had been bravely fighting ill-health, and his mark on the Society really began in 1960, when he became Chairman of the Executive Committee. ANNUAL OUTING. Mr. Sheilds Forshaw is trying to arrange a coach outing to "The Vyne" (home of Anthony Lyttleton) near Basingstoke, and to couple it with a visit to Bracknell New Town, on Saturday, 10th June. "The Vyne", an early 16th century house, is not normally open to the public on Saturdays, and present arrangements are dependent upon special permission being obtained. Final arrangements will be notified later.

BUSINESS. The Annual Report is now being drafted and it will undoubtedly show that the past year has been one of active progress. Our greatest concern at the moment is the acquisition by the G.L.C. of properties in the Victoria Drive area. I re-iterate my plea at last year's Annual Meeting for a much greater increase in membership, to give added weight to any representations we make to this powerful body.
